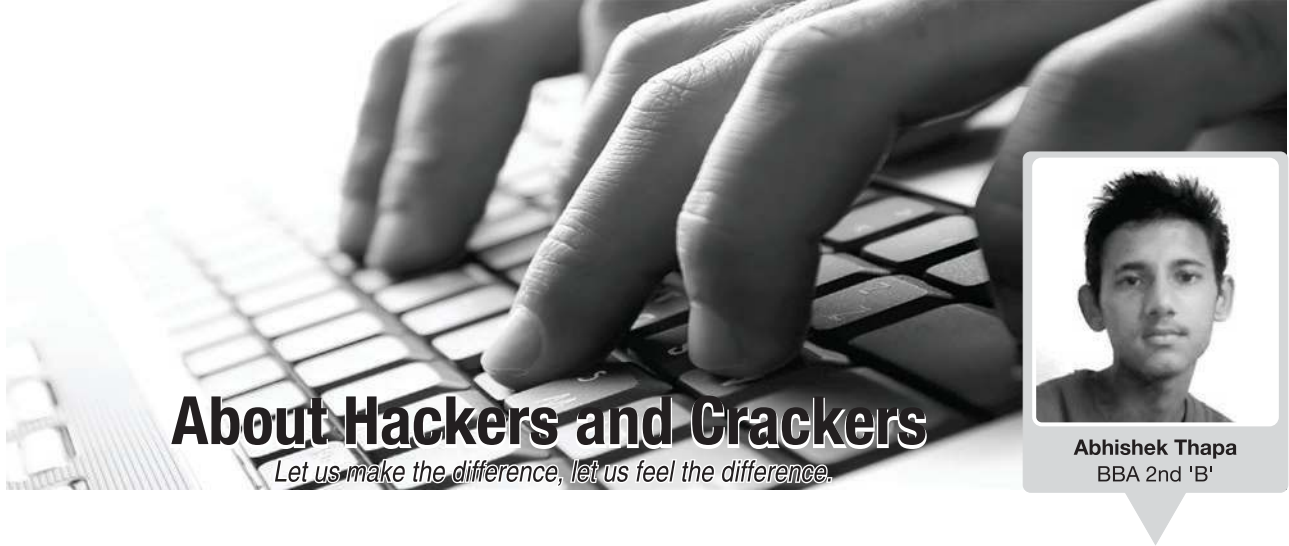

# DREAMING DRAGON



Tourism today is on doldrums due to the massive earth quake of April 25 this year. The fear psychological embedded in the hearts and minds through international channels pervasively lopsided telecast has ruined the imminent trade to desperation. As life in Nepal has already returned normalcy, the lack luster media plan and follow up niche marketing has been adding salt to whose further complicating the severity. Had our national channels popular and transcended to inter-continental show, we would be to reinforce international publicity and expand Nepal Airlines' network. Intensification of our national campaigns in the traditional and emerging markets through the double sword strategy would only make us reach to the destination desired. Therefore, first and foremost job of our destination promoters dealing with China is much easier due to the non-influence of international channel there and bonhomie between the Governments of the two friendly countries.

Tourism between Nepal and China is not an old phenomenon. It gained prominence mainly after the signing of the Approved Destination Status (ADS) by these two countries in 2001. Nepal was the ninth country in the world to achieve this status with China and first among South Asian countries. This shows the high importance China accords Nepal. In the year of signing of ADS, the number of Chinese tourists to Nepal was 8,738, which reached to over 123,000 by the end of 2013, second only to India. One of the reason in increment of Chinese tourist visiting Nepal is bonhomie between two governments. China attaches great importance to Government to Government (G2G) relations. This determines future policy. In contrast, democratic countries deal through Business to Business (B2B) relations, or dictats of market forces (demand and supply). In China, most entrepreneurial decisions are government approved, hence we rarely hear of bankruptcies, liquidations and mergers for capital supplement there. Moreover, the cost of capital in China is comparatively low because of its huge trade surplus.

Both the countries have worked to protect each other's interests. Nepal's 'One China Policy' has been the bastion of our foreign policy with China, irrespective of our government form. Since media in China is controlled by the state, they repeatedly highlights positive aspects of Nepal, particularly visits made by their government heads or officials. This positive vibe has helped in healthy, cost-free promotion of our country in China.

Moreover many top Chinese film producers have started choosing Nepal as their filming destination. Up in the Airs was a blockbusters movie shot in Nepal, by one of the great Chinese producers, and the beautiful places in Nepal covered by the movie has inspired other Chinese to visit Nepal. It is learnt that China plans to send over a million Chinese tourists to this country coming years. With colossal prospect, many Chinese airlines have doubled their flights and many new comers are in the pipeline. Presently, with the addition of a few more airlines, the China -Nepal travel quota would be exhausted. This means newcomers from China either have to force their government for renewal of Air Services Agreement (ASA) so that more flights can be arranged; or they have to vie for Joint ventures (JV) with Nepali investors by registering company in Nepal. So far very few have applied for added seats as there are great bottlenecks to be overcome.

With renewed optimism for investment and relative peace and stability over the last few years, many China have shown interest in investing in tourism and aviation industry. Tourism destinations in Nepal have been busy throughout as more and more Chinese come. It is surprising to see Jyatha (adjacent to Thamel), hub of Nepali Tourism, turning into a virtual China Town, with signboards and billboards all enticing Chinese tourists- in Chinese. Likewise, tourism towns in Nepal have transformed their means and settings, again primarily aiming to lure more Chinese. They consume all kinds of services. For instance, if one looks at bungee

jumping or paragliding bookings, they are all booked for weeks, mostly by Chinese tourists. We can bring more tourist if Nepal's national flag carrier resumes its flight to China or if the government grants other interested private players the right to fly to China. This is importance to break the price monopoly. Kathmandu –Lhasa is one of the expensive flight in the world even though the route takes under an hour to cover. If such arbitrary pricing can be done away with, there is yet more room for growth in the number of Chinese tourists visiting Nepal.

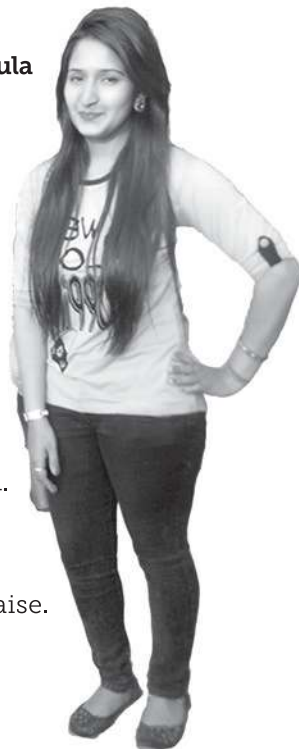
If border hassles were removed, many choose to travel by land. If we could someone cash in our six decades of friendship and resume land movements and with it, provision for temporary driving for temporary driving licenses for China vehicles or start luxury bus services between cities of the two countries, there could be a surge in the number of budget travelers.

Nepal should build an enticing Chinese complex within Lumbini to commemorate the 60th year of our bilateral relations. This would make both sets of governments promotes Lumbini as a must-visit site. What better way to celebrate our long friendship!

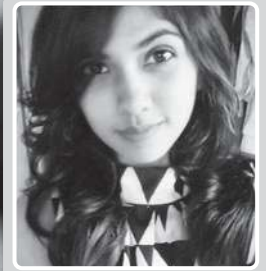

### SOME OF THE TIPS:-

1. Time perfect: make sure that the speech you deliver is perfectly timed. The concept is simple, don't overuse or underuse the allocated time.
2. Start your speech strongly: the first ten seconds of the speech is how the audience judge you.
3. Practise, practise, practise: make sure you know the concept and core of your speech before you deliver it. A good public speaker is somehow good at practising.
4. Keep an eye contact: audience love to feel empowered and engaged with the speaker. Make sure you spread your eye contact to all the audience to draw them in.
5. Positive body language: it can enhance your presentation more than the way words can. Body language accounts for 50% of your communication. It includes smiling, opening your arms, upright stance etc. use it effectively.
6. Gestures: A good speaker uses natural gestures. This means using your hands to present your thoughts.
7. Organize your speech logically: just as a good story has logic and structure a speech must also be organized logically. Organize your speech in 3 parts introduction=20%, body=60%, conclusion=20%.
8. Connect with your audience: public speaking is connecting with the audience making it interesting to learn and understand. This can

be accomplished through story telling and giving advice.

The most important thing is that you need to practise these things by yourself. Just reading some tips or watching videos on YouTube doesn't work. If you do not practise and think you can win it, you are really setting yourself up for a failure. Take a deep breath and do practise in front of the mirror or record your performance and evaluate it by yourself. "Fear is only as deep as the mind allows" Replace time spent on worrying with time spent on preparing thoroughly for your presentation, minimum three minutes a day and the tenth day will be your final day then go out there and win them over.

A man next to you reaches into his pocket and pulls out a gun. He looks around, first at you, then into his lap while his hand slowly goes up as he brings the gun closer to his face. Bang, that's it, it's over, the act has been done! .Would you let it happen? Would you be willing to sit silently and let him kill himself? After all, he is someone's son, brother, husband, father. No, you would intervene, attempt to take the gun away from him, and try to stop him from committing suicide. Why? Because killing oneself is wrong. An act against nature, an act against God.

But we let this happen every day; in our drawing rooms, in the restaurants, at the bus stops. We let people kill themselves, slowly, very slowly. Only this time, the weapon is much smaller and socially acceptable. It is a cigarette. Cigarette smoking is a popular method of tobacco consumption worldwide. In Nepal, tobacco used in various forms such as Beedismoking, a most popular form in the Terai region followed by cigarette smoking and use of various smokeless tobaccos Surti (dry tobacco leaf mixed with lime), Khaini, snuff, Gutkha, Paan masala, Pan Parag, rajanighanda with tulsia and green Paan leaf with betel nut and tobacco ingredients are the common chewing forms of tobacco. The use of tobacco is considerably higher in the rural areas than in the urban areas, particularly among the youth. Male consume more tobacco products than females.

The prevalence of tobacco product users is the highest (68.2%) in the high mountain Region followed by the Terai region (42.4%) and mid hilly Region (40.9%). In Nepal, chronic non-communicable diseases of respiratory, cardiovascular and, nervous system, Cancers of oral cavity, respiratory and digestive organs, premature deaths caused by tobacco is around 42%. Tobacco is the most common risk factor, which has become the world's leading killer, responsible for many cancers.

Lung cancer is the commonest tobacco-attributed cancer in both genders, this is one of

the common causes of death from cancers in Nepal. The major part of the population in Nepal is not aware of risk factors leading to cancers and other diseases. Therefore, fight against tobacco use becomes challenging, difficult and more complex. The socio-cultural and economical factors stand as barriers. Long-term plans with effective actions are necessary to control tobacco use and prevent more tobacco related deaths saving huge preventable expenses.

# Jurisprudential Foundation of law and morality

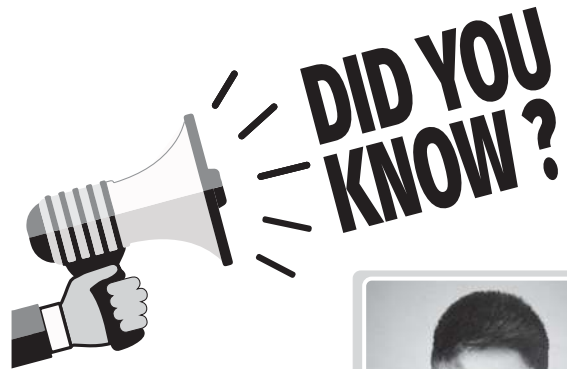
The aim of morality in its social signification are directed towards increasing social harmony by diminishing the incidence of excessive selfishness, noxious conduct towards other, internecine struggle, and other potentially disintegrative forces in societal life.

The law regulates the external relations of men, while morality governs their inner life and motivations. According to this view, morality is autonomous and coming from within man's soul, while the law is heteronymous and being imposed upon man from without. That's what, a legal system must rest on a sense of moral obligation or on the conviction of the moral value of the system, since it does not and cannot rest of mere power of man over man.

Where in Nepal, many Acts including constitution shows at a thousand points the influence of both accepted social morality and wider moral ideals. These influences enter into law either abruptly and avowedly through legislation, or silently and piecemeal through the judicial process. For example, Annapurna Rana's Case, in this case, our Supreme Court had broadly talked about morality and judgement was delivered in favour of Annapurna Rana. The decision of Supreme Court has shown as inspired by morality and has become law of the land in future case. It is nothing but instance of morality.

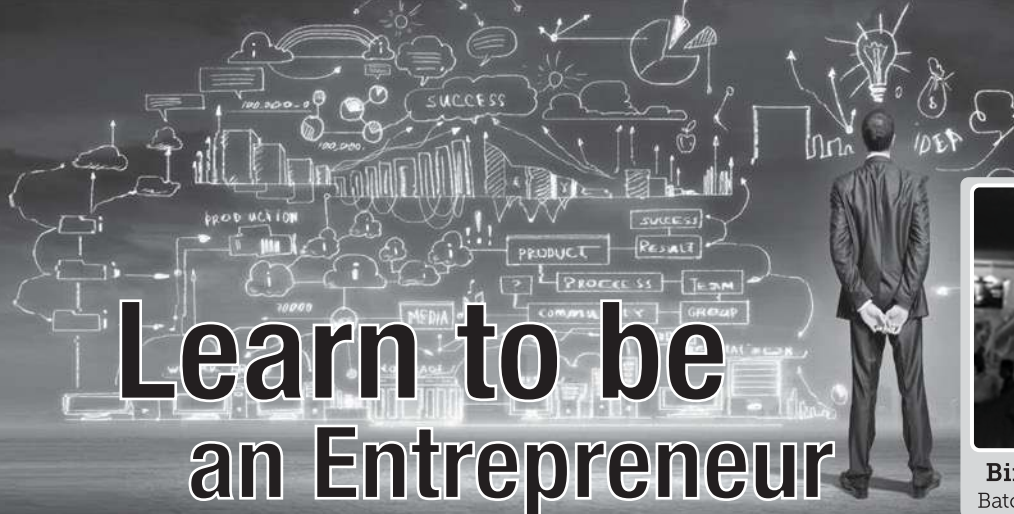
Those tenets of moral rightness which are considered basic and imperative for social intercourse will be endowed in all societies with an obligatory character of great strength. This strengthening of their binding force is accomplished by converting them into rules of law. \*Advocate, former vice-president, KTM Bar Association, LL.M (Commercial Law), India Thus, the prohibition of murder, rape, robbery, and physical assaults, the ordering of relation between the sexes, the interdiction of fraud and bad faith in the conclusion and performance of consensual agreements are examples of such transformation of moral ideas into legal prescriptions.

Indeed, most legal system or legal concept such a right, wrong, duty, obligation etc. always suggests that there is some elements present in them as discussed above. It is often said that jurisprudence depends much upon moral idea as just law correspond to positive morality and nationality grounded ethic, and a study of legal system makes it clear that though law and morals are separate but they have never been completely divorce.

# Learn to be an Entrepreneur

Burt's Bees is an American personal care product subsidiary of Clorox that describes itself as an "Earth friendly, Natural Personal Care Company making products for personal care, health, beauty, and personal hygiene". As of 2007, they manufactured over 197 products for facial and body skin care, lip care, hair care, baby care, men's grooming, and outdoor remedies distributed in nearly 30,000 retail outlets including grocery stores and drug store chains across the United States, United Kingdom, Ireland, Canada, Hong Kong, and Taiwan from their headquarters in Durham, North Carolina.

Originating in Maine in the 1980s, the business began when co-founder Roxanne Quimby started making candles from Burt Shavitz's leftover beeswax. This eventually led to their bottling and selling of honey, a practice that slowly diminished as the company evolved as a corporation. Eventually, other products using honey and beeswax, including edible spreads and furniture polish, were sold, before moving into the personal care line. In late 2007, Clorox purchased Burt's Bees for \$925 million USD.

## 1984–89: Founding

Burt's Bees originated in Maine in 1984 as a candle making partnership between Roxanne Quimby and Burt Shavitz. Shavitz had a honey business which provided the excess beeswax needed for the candles and Quimby's focus on maintaining high quality helped to grow their business from an initial \$200 at the Dover-Foxcroft Junior High School craft fair to \$20,000 by the end of their first year. Their first headquarters was an abandoned one-room schoolhouse rented from a friend for \$150 a year. Burt's Bees increased production in 1989 after a New York boutique, Zona, ordered hundreds of their beeswax candles. Forty additional employees were hired and an abandoned bowling alley became their new manufacturing location. During this time, Quimby read one of Burt Shavitz's 19th-century books about bee-keeping which included home-made personal care recipes and Burt's Bees entered into the personal care products industry.

## 1990s: Incorporated

Burt's Bees became incorporated in 1991 and had a product offering including candles, natural soaps, perfumes, and eventually lip balm, which became their best-selling product.

After threatening to sue him in 1993 because of personal issues Quimby, forced Shavitz out of the company. Increasing demand and product offerings necessitated a move from Maine headquarters to North Carolina where other personal care product manufacturers were also situated. Burt's Bees changed its focus to exclusively personal care products.

In 1994 the company moved its manufacturing operations into an 18,000-square-foot (1,700 m<sup>2</sup>) former garment factory in Creedmoor, North Carolina. Automated machines, such as a former cafeteria mixer from Duke University, were introduced to increase production, although Burt's Bees continued to focus on the "home-made" product theme. Chapel Hill was the site of the first Burt's Bees retail store which offered 50 natural personal care products. Distribution and demand of products had also reached the Japanese market.

In 1998 Burt's Bees was offering over 100 natural personal care products in 4,000 locations with sales in excess of \$8 million. Distribution had reached higher-end national retailers such as Whole Foods Market and Cracker Barrel. New product offerings branched into travel-sized skin care and hair care products. In 1999, with increasing demand and an increase product offering including sugar and milk-based body lotions and bath products, Burt's Bees relocated to Durham amongst many other high-tech companies and enterprises in the Research Triangle area of North Carolina. An e-Commerce website was launched allowing distribution in a much larger, nationwide scale.

In 1999, Quimby bought out Shavitz's 1/3 stake in the company in exchange for a house in Maine, worth approximately \$130,000.

### 2000-06: New products and AEA

In 2002 and 2003 Burt's Bees launched its first toothpaste, first shampoo, and successful Baby Bee product line of infant personal care products. The co-founder, Roxanne Quimby, also used company-earned profits to preserve 185,000 acres (750 km<sup>2</sup>) of forest land in Maine, marking the beginning of a relationship with The Nature Conservancy, an international organization engaged in environmental protection and conservation.

In 2004 private equity firm, AEA Investors, purchased 80% of Burt's Bees for \$173,000,000 US, with co-founder, Roxanne Quimby, retaining a 20% share and a seat on the board. Upon seeking compensation from Quimby after the deal, Shavitz was paid \$4 million. In 2005 Douglas Haensel, a former GE executive, became Executive Vice President and Chief Financial Officer. Michael Indursky, a former Garnier and Unilever executive, joined Burt's Bees in July to head Burt's Bees marketing and public relations group. In 2006, John Replogle, a former general manager of Unilever's skin care division, became the Chief Executive Officer and President, effective from January 19, 2006.

### 2007-present: Clorox acquisition

As of 2007, they manufactured over 197 products for facial and body skin care, lip care, hair care, baby care, men's grooming, and outdoor remedies distributed in nearly 30,000 retail outlets including grocery stores and drug store chains across the United States, United Kingdom, Ireland, Canada, Hong Kong, and Taiwan from their headquarters in Durham, North Carolina. In late 2007, the Clorox Company acquired Burt's Bees for a reported sum of \$925,000,000 USD. The company subsequently released a statement to their customers.

Replogle left Burt's Bees to become CEO and President of Seventh Generation Inc. in February 2011. In 2011 Nick Vlahos, a 15-year veteran of The Clorox Company was named Vice President and General Manager of Burt's Bees, effective April 2011.

By February 2014, the Clorox Company had increased "advertising and sales promotion spending for Burt's Bees, particularly for its lip care lines." At the time, "Burt's Bees sales [were] outpacing volume due to price increase." In August 2014, a documentary detailing the story between the two co-founders was released.

# Black Hole

The universe, unlike what people generally would like to believe, is not that friendly. It is filled with bizarre and the most alien things possible. The huge masses of rocks hurling faster than the fastest train on earth, the scorching radiations from the stars that we don't generally feel, thanks to the atmospheric shield, and the low pressure of the space trying to burst open all our veins. Above all there is the black hole – the monster of all monsters.

Don't let the name fool you: Black hole is anything but empty space. Black holes are these terrifying dense entities scattered over the universe that mercilessly grip on everything they can get their hands on. They pull specks of dust, small rocks, asteroids, planets, and even gigantic stars, and don't let any of them escape their grip. To get the sense of how strong black holes hold on to their 'prey', get this, even light can't escape them once entered. That's why they are called black holes – we cannot see them.

So, how do we know they are there? We deduce them by detecting their effect on nearby bodies. It's like looking out of a window and seeing all the tree-tops bent in one direction, and inferring that a strong wind must be blowing in that direction. When particles from nearby bodies are pulled towards a black hole, the friction results in emit of x-rays. An accretion disk is formed which is detected using x-ray detectors on earth. A phenomenon known as gravitational lensing can also tell us about the black hole's presence. If a distant galaxy and a black hole are lined up, we see a distorted image of the distant galaxy as if something in the space was bending the rays coming from the galaxy, like a lens. Einstein's General Theory of Relativity suggests that a massive object can wrap the space-time fabric so as to bend the light rays passing through it. So, we conclude that, something massive, which we cannot detect using any of our conventional means, must be out there in the darkness of the space.

Black holes appear to exist in two radically different size scales. Stellar-mass-black-holes are generally 10-24 times the mass of the sun and are peppered throughout the universe, while supermassive-black-holes are millions, or even

billions, of times as massive as the sun, and lie at the center of virtually all galaxies – including our Milky Way.

How come these destructive giants are wandering in our universe? When massive stars die, they leave behind a dense remnant core. If the remnant core is about 10 solar mass, the core collapses under its own gravity to a single point: singularity – the innermost part of a black hole. (The outermost part is called the event horizon.) This dense core has a gravity high enough to not even let light escape its bound. Thus, a black hole is formed.

One thing to be clear about is that black holes have no more vacuuming power than a normal star of the same mass. For instance, if the sun was to instantly convert into a black hole, the earth would go cold, but wouldn't budge from its orbit. In a sense, our universe is a black hole too. Think about a two dimensional world – a world on a surface of a sphere. The light beam in that universe would never know the up-direction. The light beam would never leave the surface of the sphere, essentially being trapped in that dimension. This property – not allowing light escape its bound – is of a black hole.

The final point in a black hole – singularity – is also proposed to be the seed to a new universe. Our universe is believed to be formed by a violent explosion of an infinitely small point – the phenomenon known as Big Bang. It is proposed that multiple such universes may exist, and singularities can be what explodes to form all the matter in that new universe.

General relativity theory predicts, that nothing would happen when you reach the event horizon. You just pass through, unaware that you're now lost to the rest of the universe. You're fine. Your watch on your wrist ticks along as usual. Though you would be frozen at the horizon for the observers outside the black hole. It's often said that black holes are infinitely deep, but this is not true. There is a bottom. You won't live to see it. Gravity, as you fall, will grow

stronger. The pull on your feet, if you're falling feet first, will be so much greater than the tug on your head that you'll be stretched until you're ripped apart – you will be 'spaghettified'.

Besides what we said about the ferocity of black holes, there is still a chance that they could be ruthless. Samir Mathur, professor of physics at The Ohio State University and black hole sympathizer, thinks that black holes aren't that ruthless, all-consuming mega-behemoths that we've made them out to be. He proposed the 'fuzz ball theory' for black holes, which is based on the string theory and suggests that the event horizon is not rigidly defined, but is fuzzy, and when you reach the horizon, nothing would happen to you, rather a hologram replica of you would be created and would be 'sent' inside the black hole.

So, we may say that black holes are the terrifying all-swallowing entities wandering in our universe, which may be the mother of other multiple universes.

Some years back, the London Catholic Times printed the following letter which had been sent by an Englishman to a well-known hospital in answer to an appeal for a donation.

"For the following reasons, I am unable to send you a larger cheque: I have been held up, held down, sand-bagged, walked upon, flattened out and squeezed by the income tax, the super tax, the Motor tax, and by every society, organization and club that the inventive mind of man can think of extracting what I may or may not have in my possession; for the Red Cross, the Black Cross, the Ivory Cross, the Double Cross and for every hospital in town and in the country. The Government has governed my business till I don't know who runs it. I am inspected, suspected, examined and re-examined, informed, required, and commanded so that I don't know who I am, what I am, why I am or why I am here at all. I am supposed to be an inexhaustible supply of money for every need, desire or hope of the human race and because I will not go out and beg, borrow or steal money to give away. I am cursed, discussed, boycotted, talked to, talked about, held up, hung up, robbed and well-high ruined. The only reason why I am clinging to life at all is to see what is going to happen next."

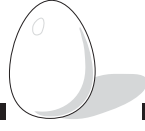
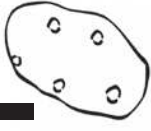
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# Potatoes Eggs & Coffee beans

# Origin of the essay and Sir Francis Bacon

Introduction: Today, most people wonder how or when the essay form originated. The ancestor of essay is credited to classical literature. Sir Francis Bacon traces the history of the essays to the epistles of Seneca (teacher of the Roman emperor Nero). Seneca's epistles to Lucilius are actually essays that are dispersed meditations, though it is in the form of epistles (letters).

Montaigne, a French writer, is called the grandfather of essays. His full name was Michael Eyquem De Montaigne (1533-1592). He was a French nobleman, who invented the form of the essay. Montaigne humbly called his essays as "Essais" or attempts. "Essais" had a modest meaning that the contents were not serious, logically composed discourses or treatises. The inventor of the essay did not realize the value of the pieces he had written. Also, he called his "essais" as "inepties" or "sottises". He had introduced a new mode of self-expression or a new form of literature in the world. Around 1588, Montaigne had introduced in his essays a new fashion of writing briefly, irregularly, with constant digressions and interruptions about the world as it appears to the individual. Five years after the death of Montaigne came Francis Bacon. Montaigne's essays were read in England, but it was written in French or Latin. Montaigne's essays were not well known till 1603, when it was translated into English. Bacon's essays were not in the tradition of Montaigne. Although critics say the first great



name in essay writing goes to Montaigne, the greatest essayist in the English language was undoubtedly Sir Francis Bacon. Bacon wrote his essays in aphoristic style and it was largely philosophical. Bacon says that his essays are "brief notes set down rather significantly than anxiously". Bacon wrote the first edition of his essays in 1597, and there were ten essays. The second essays came out in 1612, and it had thirty-eight essays. The third or last edition came out in 1625, and it had fifty-eight essays of which twenty were entirely new. Another laurel is that Bacon was the greatest philosophical writer of the seventeenth century. If you consider him as a philosopher, his objective was the discovery of truth. He had a passion for research and to research vigorously for facts, of correcting false concepts with evidence. Due to this, he had a great influence on later scientists, who adopted his method and way of thinking. Bacon was even regarded as the father of modern science, but this applies only to his ideas and not to his methods.

**Characteristics of Bacon's Essays:** Bacon's essays are short, brief and packed with wisdom. His essays comprise of crisp and aphoristic sentences. It was a new manner of writing which he introduced to the English language. His essays differ from one another in form and theme. For Bacon, the real business of the essay is to be largely personal. The strength of Bacon's style lies in the pithy conciseness, pregnant metaphors, and epigrammatic brevity. Bacon

writes for the scholar and the intellectual class. Fifty per cent of Bacon's essays give wise counsel to the king about statesmanship. However Bacon follows Machiavelli for whom "the end justifies the means". Like Machiavelli, Bacon establishes a double standard of morality, one for the prince and the other for his subjects. The common code of morality does not apply to the king. Bacon advises the king to rule by craft and cunning. Bacon's attitude towards life is that of the practical man, of one who seeks success in life. It means the ability to rise high in life. He does not forbid man to take recourse to immoral means for personal gain. Yet he forbids him from harming the state. As a practical philosopher, Bacon is not blind to high moral qualities and nobility of character. Bacon belonged to the high class, where people contended with one another for success. The high class used intrigue, fraud, deceit, and lies to achieve their objective. They flattered the king and the rulers to gain the favour of the great Bacon's Ideas in his Essays: Bacon's worldly - mindedness can be seen in his essay 'On Truth'. In that essay he highly extols truth as the sovereign good of human nature. Yet he allows some lies too, as he points out that "the mixture of falsehood is like alloy in coins of gold and silver, which may make the metal work better". In his essay 'On Studies', he wrote: "Crafty men condemn studies: simple men admire them: and wise men use them". Also he says, "Some books are to be tasted, others to be swallowed, and some few to be chewed and digested". In 'Of Travel' he wrote, "Travel in the youngest sort, is a part of education: in the elder, a part of experience". In 'Of Marriages...', he wrote, "Wives are young men's mistresses, companions for the middle age, and old men's nurses". In 'Of Revenge', he wrote, "Revenge is a kind of wild justice".

In his later essays, he gave a better form. His thoughts became better connected, the style was richer and more mellow. Here are some examples:

**"Virtue is like precious odours, most fragrant when they are incensed or crushed".**

**"Suspicious amongst thoughts are like bats amongst birds, they fly best by twilight".**

**"History makes men wise, poets witty, the mathematics subtle, natural philosophy deep, morals grave, logic and rhetoric able to contend".**

Bacon's keen sense of analogy made him put illustrations, metaphors, similes and other figurative language everywhere. His prose has a poetic quality.

Not all his ideas will be accepted by all. For example, his economic theories and views on banks have become out of date. Nobody will think of entrusting the nation's capital to private money lenders. Also the days of economic prosperity through war, empires and colonies are over.

**Conclusion:** To sum up, we can safely say that Bacon showed a greater inclination towards practical rather moral considerations. So here was the greatest essayist of English literature, who started a new genre, and influenced all other essayists who came after him, such as, Sir William Cornwallis, Robert Johnson, etc. Even the Nepali poet Laxmi Prasad Devkota was influenced by the idea of Bacon that 'the real business of the essay was to be largely personal'. However, not all prose writers imitated the writings of Bacon because it was too cumbersome and stiff and hard to write. This uniqueness of Bacon's essays has made him outstanding and remembered by posterity.

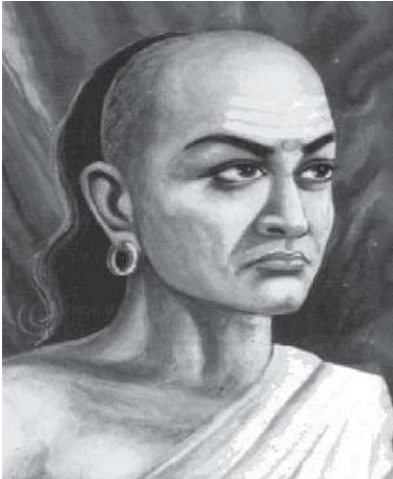

# Interview with Malvika Subba



**1. As you are known as the most active and talented Miss Nepal, how do you feel about yourself?**

You know, I find it very funny that people compare me with other Miss Nepal. I don't think it's fair comparing one individual to the other because Miss Nepal is not my life.

It was a title I got more than 13 years ago but that is not me any more because I was 21 and now I am 34, of course I carried out my responsibility very well but nothing of my conscious decision was like oh! I was "Miss Nepal" I should go this way or I am "Miss Nepal" I should be in this way. Besides that, media was my interest and because of that I was always in the limelight. I am always seen in the media doing this and that and I am socially a very active person. May be because of that people feel like she is still there doing her things, otherwise it's not my conscious decision like Oh! I need to outshine everybody or I need to prove myself. It just happens. That's how it is, I guess.

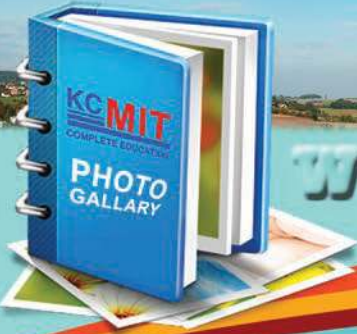

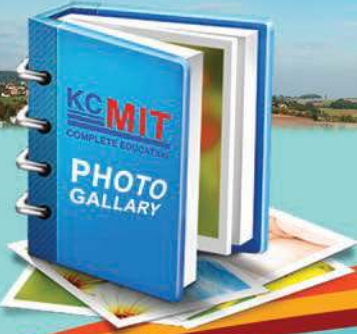

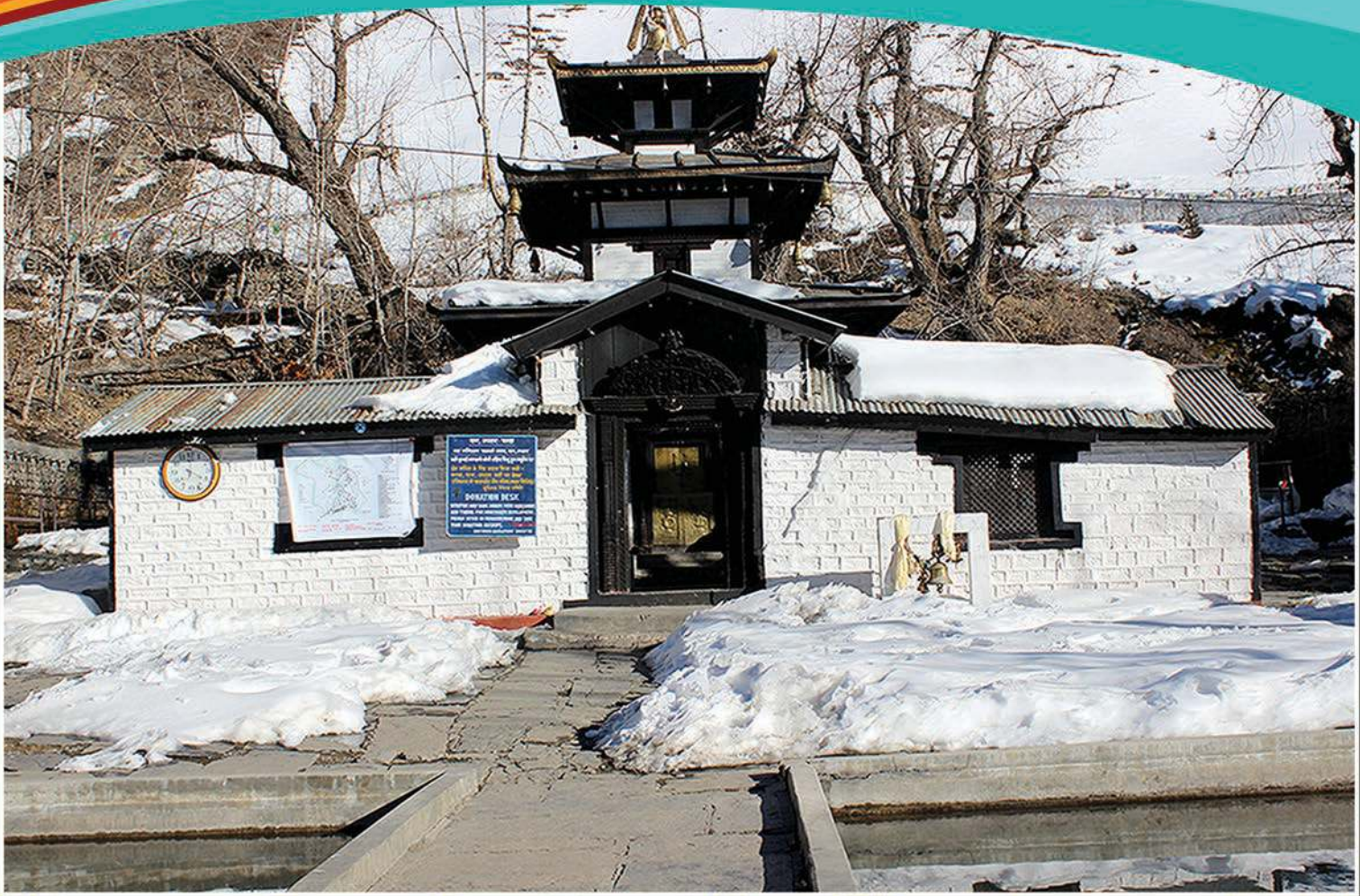

# How Technology is changing disaster Relief



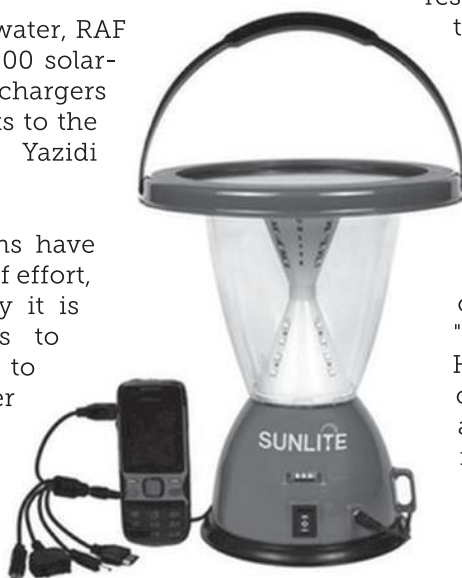

"When the British government delivered emergency aid to people fleeing Islamic militants in northern Iraq one of its primary concerns was how the refugees might charge their mobile phones?"

Alongside tents and drinking water, RAF planes dropped more than 1,000 solar-powered lanterns attached to chargers for all types of mobile handsets to the stranded members of the Yazidi religious community.

It is the first time the lanterns have been airdropped in such a relief effort, but humanitarian workers say it is part of the growing efforts to develop technology designed to make a difference in disaster zones.

In 2010, Dr Paul Gardner-Stephen, a computer system researcher at Flinders University in Australia, was driving to work in his car when he first heard radio reports of the devastation of the Haiti earthquake, more than 10,000 miles away. With roads blocked, infrastructure reduced to



rubble and mobile networks down, he realized something needed to be done, and quickly.

"You typically have about three days to restore the communications before the bad people realize the good people aren't in control anymore," he says. His solution was to develop the technology that allows mobile phones to communicate directly with each other even where there is no network coverage, or when mobile masts have been knocked out of action - a system known as "mesh networking" can be used. His Serve Project work means users can send text messages, make calls and send files to other users nearby, creating a mobile network through a web of users.

It is just one example of the dozens of technologies developed in the wake of Haiti to help relief efforts in disaster zones. "There's plenty of technology for rich white men," Dr Gardner-Stephen says. "It's the rest of the world that we need to help."

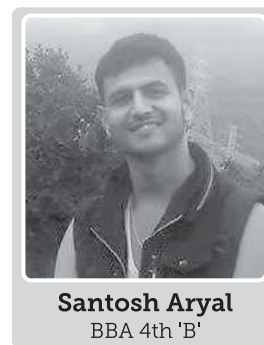

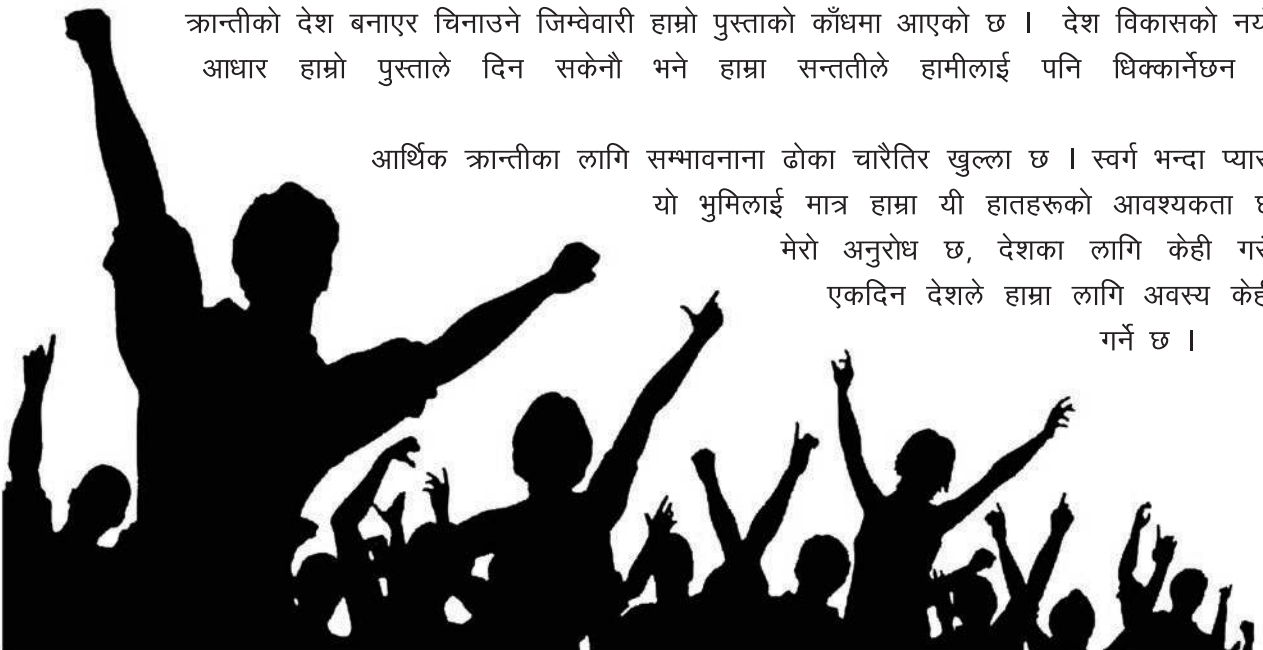

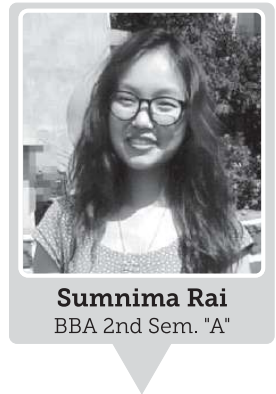

But, there are around 230 elderly people in the Pashupati Old-Age Home who share a similar fate of being abandoned by their offsprings (the solemn purpose of their lives)

"He did not care for me since he returned, it's better to be childless than to have a child like," sobbed Phul Kumari Tamang 61, one of the inhabitants of the Old-Age Home. Tamang had sent her only child, a son to Japan for further studies some years ago, but he did not bother to care for her on his return.

It amazes me how children can abandon their parents just because they are too old to be taken care of. According to the Nepali culture, when people become old, they are cared by their children and grandchildren. But it seems like we are changing for the worse-extending to nuclear family from joint family. There are around 90 shelters across Nepal for the elderly people and it is just a matter of time when the number of old age homes will grow like mushroom in Nepal; leaving the elderly people lonely and helpless. And this is what makes me wonder at times, how people fall under the species of Chameleons which have the ability to change their colors; and how people fall under the category of parasites where one specie benefits at the expense of the other. Either way, they do not fail to amaze me. How egocentric can a man be?

If we talk to the inmates of any old age home, their story would be much the same, chaos in the family, disgust against the old and finally removal of the elders from the family scene. These elderly people are in the old homes not by their own choice, but as they have no better

alternatives left. The only solace is that, they will have their daily needs fulfilled but the pain of being abandoned, neglected and unwanted by their own children will always leave them hollow.

According to the latest census, there are 2.6% elderly citizens in the country. Many resort to shelters for the old, while some choose streets as their addresses. May be the lesson of "Respect your elders-love your juniors"and "Parents are a form of God" were only taught but never learnt. We are failing those icons; who personify pure love and selfless act. We are failing our culture. More so, we are failing ourselves- turning our back to those people who did not abandon us when we were helpless and dependent on them; but we abandon them for those very reasons in their old age without thinking twice. Being the youth of today, we have raised our voice against child-abuse, women violence, sexual abuse or other acts we feel wrong. But when it comes to elderly people; why do we only volunteer at the old age home? Why are there no voices for those abandoned voiceless? Is not the abandonment of elderly people a serious matter? I fear that in matter of time, the culture of abandoning parents will be deep rooted and a general practice among the Nepalese. The self-centered generations from now will learn to abandon their parents if we do not consider this seriously.

It breaks my heart to see old people on the streets or in the old age home having nowhere to go. I had enough of extending hands to help them. And I had enough of hearing them being pitied. I had enough of watching them being abandoned. I had enough of seeing their bitter destiny. Now, let us think for a while for these elderly people abandoned by their own blood and raise our voices against the abandonment of elderly people; "AGAINST THE BITTER DESTINY".

# THE FLASHBACK



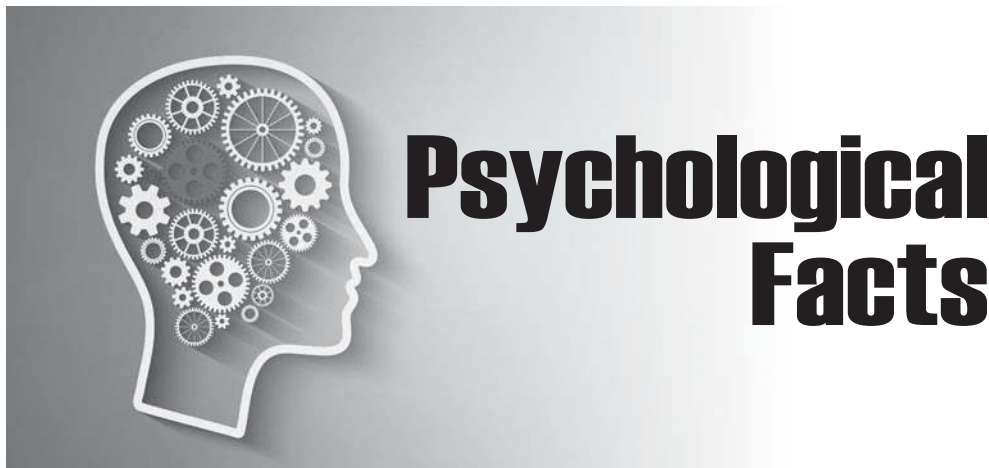

## **1. Would you like to share a few things with us regarding your work life?**

- I was in the US before. When I was there primarily I got introduced to lots of people had the approach to technology and this was what I did before Microsoft. For me selling computers and hardware was not interesting. I was interested in software and that was how I got involved. My career was in different areas .First I ran a magazine . - I like working in this industry every day, every time because it's a new time every time due to the changing technology and what I dislike about working in this industry is that people do not know how to work together.

**8. Can you suggest the skill required for this profession ?**

- Keep an open mind and to learn new things are the key skills for this field.

**9. Would you mind sharing the working environment of this company?**

- We do a lot of trainings. So again the way we work is aligned with the needs of the youth. We make sure that they are growing from a caterpillar to a butterfly.

**10. What might be the reason for customers selecting this company?**

- Microsoft is user friendly and easy to use . All the basic required information is available and can be used easily,so customers select Microsoft.

**11. What are the alternatives about this field?**

**13. Are you optimistic about the company's future and your future with the company?**

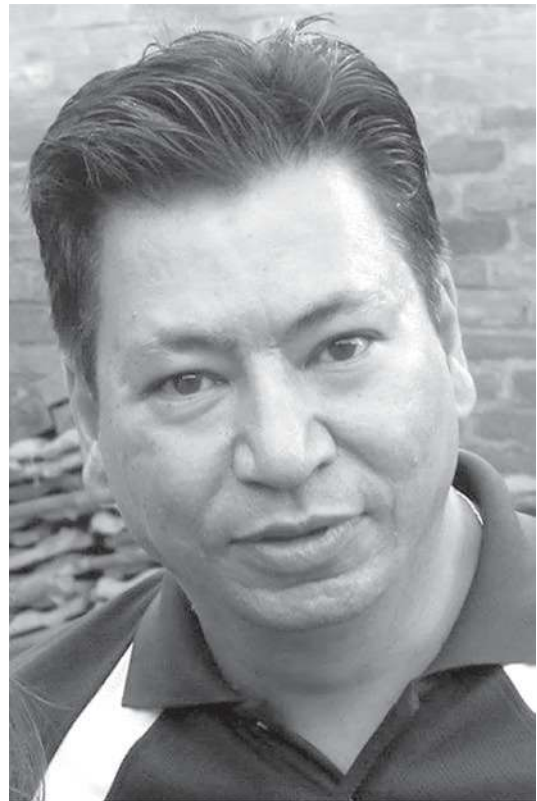

# CONCENTRATION

## “KEY TO SUCCESS”



Our world has become busier and busier with more TV Stations, Radio Stations, Websites, E-mails, Mobile Phones and other forms of interruptions in the daily life. We become overwhelmed with new ways of simplifying life, but in reality the so called time saving devices end up chewing up more and more of our time. At the End of the day all of us say, we wanted to be successful but are not able to focus on anything!

One of the secrets to success that I want to share with you is the 'quiet and powerful' tool successful people have been using to climb the ladder of great achievement. We don't need to be extraordinary and super natural to apply this key. Ordinary people like you and me have already used it knowingly or unknowingly to achieve extraordinary results several times.

This magic key is "Concentration". It is a 13 lettered word. Which is very simple but powerful. It has a tremendous power that transforms life like a tornado in action. Concentration has been defined as "the ability to direct one's thinking in whatever direction one intends".

Success and failures are part of the progress in life. However success and failures have to be handled differently. It is also observed that despite the differences in the way the two are to be handled, there are some aspects, which are common to both. One of the key common factors for both success and failure is Concentration.

Successive failures some time make one think of failures which prevent one from bringing back the focus to the task in question.

This can be amply seen in our cricketing world, with which most of us are familiar. There have been several instances, when batsmen after achieving a milestone, like having scored a century, a double hundred, tend to throw away their wicket. This is due to the sudden shift in the

focus of continuous task, to the happiness of success. Similarly, the failures of capable batsmen were mainly due to the lack of concentration, letting their thoughts drift to those aspects not relevant to the game. Concentration can improve with constant habits and training. Concentration will be required to retain ones focus while reaping success and also to bring back the lost focus due to failures. We all have the ability to concentrate. But at times our thoughts are scattered, and our minds race from one thing to another. To deal with such times, we need to learn and practise concentration, skills and strategies. To concentrate, we have to learn a skill, and as with any skill this means practice repeated day after day until we achieve enough improvement to feel that we can concentrate when we need to.

### **Our ability to concentrate depends on:**

1. Our Commitment: We need to make a personal commitment to put in the effort needed to do the task in the way which we realistically plan to do it. If we just play at it in a half-hearted manner then it is much more difficult to take the task and ourselves seriously.
2. Our Enthusiasm for the task: If we are interested in the task and enjoy doing it, then we find it easy to motivate ourselves to start. Once started, our feelings of involvement in the activity keep us going - we want to do it.
3. Skill at doing the task: Knowing how to do something gives confidence that our efforts will be successful, so we don't have to deal with anxiety whether this will work or not. Anxiety tends to impair concentration.
4. Our Emotional and physical state: When we are in good physical condition - i.e. feeling relaxed and comfortable - and our emotions are calm, then we tend to be positive about things. This in turn raises self-esteem, which makes us more able to concentrate, because we don't have to worry about how awful we are or life is.

5. Our Psychological state: For example, if we are in an obsession or distracted state our thoughts are pre-occupied, leaving little mental space to think about anything else.
6. Our Environment: It is much more difficult to concentrate if our surroundings keep intruding on our awareness, because it is noisy, too hot or too cold, the furniture is uncomfortable or the people around us are stressing out.

Finally we can say that concentration helps us to solve problems and come up with the fastest path to attain our goals. It is very difficult to

succeed without concentration. A mind that concentrates is a beautiful mind. It is a mind that will get results and give us power to overcome challenges. We all have different levels of concentration. Concentration can be improved through practice and avoiding distractions.

So we can clearly say that Concentration is a Magical Key to Success.

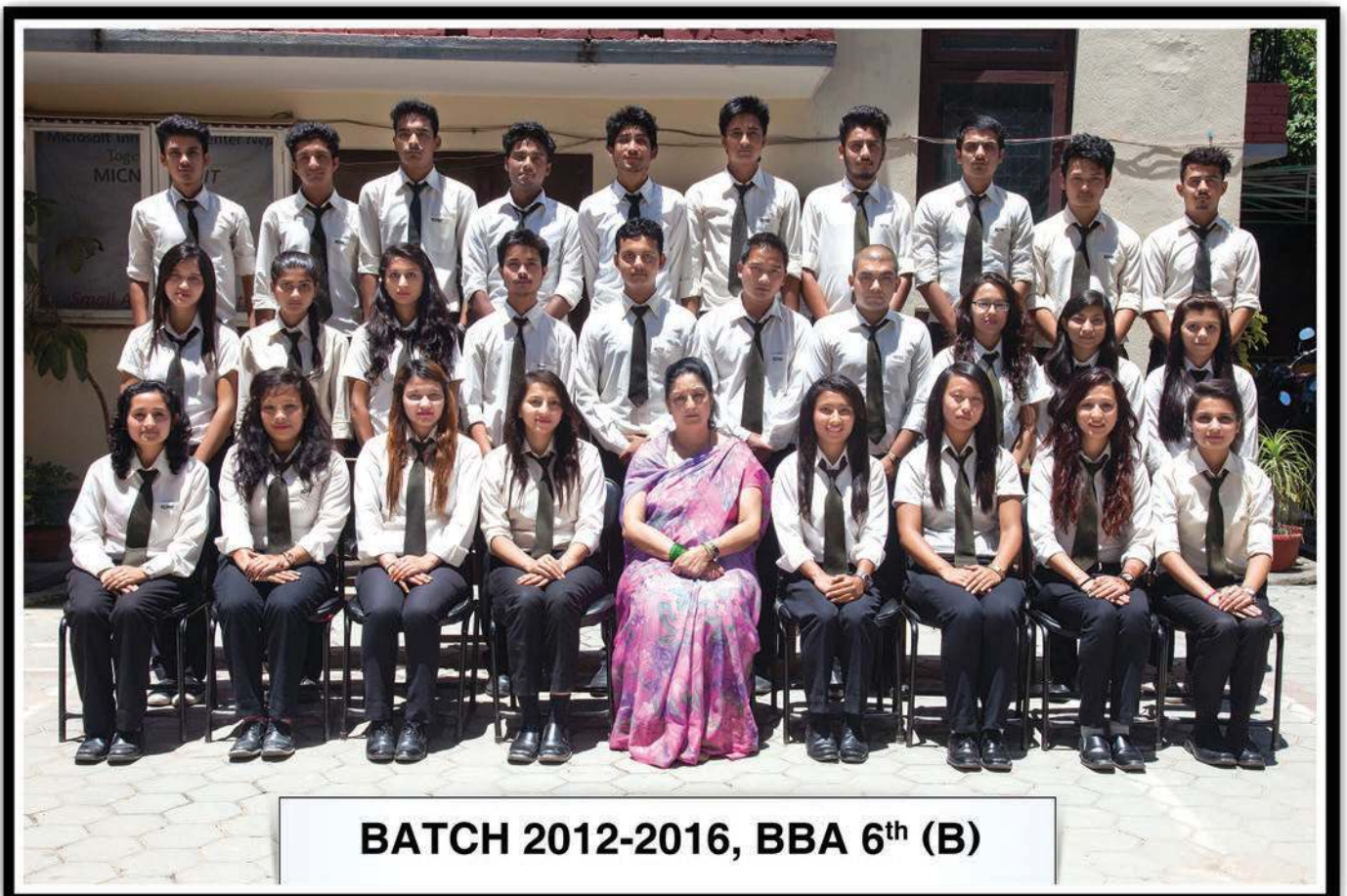
